Bina's family was suffering in silence. Nobody really knew. But God did. One day, our church volunteer felt a strong burden in their heart. Moved by the Holy Spirit, the volunteer reached out to the palliative care team. The very next day, our team went to visit. Nothing could have prepared us for what we saw. Bina was lying weak and not fully conscious in a house that was falling apart. The air smelled of neglect, sadness and years of silent cries. Her young daughter, Tina, had left her school and childhood behind to become her mother's caregiver. Bina's husband was also addicted to alcohol. The home was filled with shouting, pain, and hopelessness.

Through regular home visits, phone calls, and Constant prayers, we stayed with them. It was not just medical care—it was God's healing hand working through us.

And then, a miracle began to unfold. The house that was once full of fights became a home of peace. Bina began to smile, to laugh. Her husband started changing too. Tina went back to school. And Bina—our once frail and forgotten
